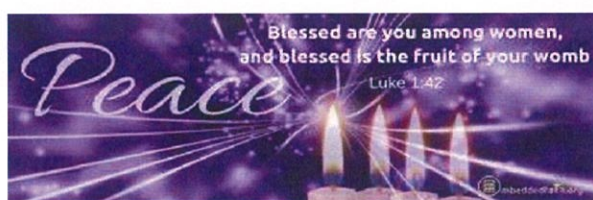

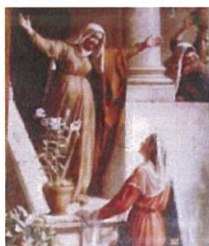

### FIRST READING – Micah 5: 1-4

A reading from the prophet Micah

The Lord says this:

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah,  
the least of the clans of Judah,  
out of you will be born for me  
the one who is to rule over Israel;  
his origin goes back to the distant past,  
to the days of old.

The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till  
the time when she who is to give birth gives

with the power of the Lord,  
with the majesty of the name of his God.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

then I said,  
just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book,  
'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law  
lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the  
sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the  
sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and  
then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will.  
He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the  
second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the  
offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus  
Christ.
