ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY 2019

Today is Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday and is a significant celebration in our Church's calendar. Whilst providing us with an opportunity to acknowledge our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander brothers and sisters, the celebration also signifies that we are united as one in God's love and care. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics number over 130,000 and are a growing demographic in our Church today. We must continue to reach out and provide opportunities where we may be enriched and nourished by their deep spirituality, culture and love for Jesus Christ, by opening the doors to our hearts and our homes.

In the Gospel of the day Jesus says "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Just as Jesus did, we must meet people where they are and walk alongside our First Nation's peoples on their journey to reconciliation and justice.

Liturgy of the Word

"Christ is present above all in the Eucharist, but Christ is also present in the Scriptures [...]. The Liturgy of the Word includes the readings from Scripture, the responsory, the gospel acclamation, the homily, the profession of faith, and the universal prayer. In the Scriptures God speaks to the people. In silence and singing, the people make God's word their own. In the Creed they affirm their adherence to God's word. In the universal prayer (prayer of the faithful) those who have been nourished by God's word pray for the needs of the Church and the world [...]." (Paul Turner, *Let Us Pray: A Guide to the Rubrics of Sunday Mass*)

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* highlights the importance of making God's word our own, and doing so in silence and in the responses and petitions. Our listening to the word of God, doing all we can to take it in and letting it be within, is a task, sometimes a challenge, that is before us each time God's word is proclaimed. This is a work of interiorisation: allowing God's word to truly speak to us personally and to pray within. The first step, though, is to listen most attentively, with the 'ear of our heart'. Some will follow the readings as they are printed in the bulletin, and have 'an ear' to the reader. Yet the readings can be left to be returned to later while, as God's word is proclaimed, the focus and engagement is centred more fully on the person who proclaims.

GOSPEL – Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.
