A Huge THANK YOU! Thank you very much for continuing to remember your support of St. Kevin's Parish during this period when we do not have our usual gatherings for Sunday Mass. Your ongoing financial support has been very heartening, particularly when the Presbytery collection is also remembered (providing for the priests of the parish and presbytery running costs, the Archbishop, and, more generally, priests of the Archdiocese). My strong sense is that a significant number of parishioners are aware that what the parish (both for the Parish and Presbytery) is currently receiving is well down on what would normally be received.

JUNE – till Friday 26th : *Temporary Times*

Currently it is possible to have 20 attendees, apart from the small number of support people. In these weeks:

- Tuesdays, Mass will be celebrated at 9.15am and 5.00pm.
- Wednesdays, Mass will be celebrated at 9.15am and 7.00pm (followed by Novena).
- Thursdays, Mass will be celebrated at 9.15am and 5.00pm.
- Fridays, Mass will be celebrated at 9.15am and 7.00pm.

Parishioners who wish to attend a Mass, are requested to come to the church at a time when the church is open (see below) in order to register for a Mass. Out of consideration for others, **please register for only one Mass in the week**. Only when all Masses in the week have been filled will people be registered for Masses in the following week.

The church will be open for private prayer on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 10.00am till 11.00am. The Sacrament of Penance/ Reconciliation is available on Saturdays from 9.45am till 10.30am.

There will be a continuation of the hygiene and disinfectant measures as well as the monitoring of doors (entry door). The Records Book will be maintained and the hand sanitiser is used before proceeding to occupy a designated seat in the church. The available seating is arranged as near to the sanctuary as possible.
