FIRST READING – Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11.

A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

‘Console my people, console them’
says your God.

‘Speak to the heart of Jerusalem
and call to her
that her time of service is ended,
that her sin is atoned for,
that she has received from the hand of the Lord
double punishment for her crimes.’

A voice cries, ‘Prepare in the wilderness

Instructions for parishioners

1. Chairs will be provided.
2. The gate will be opened 30 minutes ahead of scheduled Mass times. Please arrive at least 10 minutes prior to the start of Mass so that you can be signed in and seated for a punctual start. Gate will be shut 5 minutes prior to the start of Mass.
3. The maximum capacity is 300 per Mass, once 300 attendees are recorded the gates will be closed.
4. Please do not bring any food onto the premises.
5. Please follow all directions when entering and exiting the venue and during Mass.

MASS OUTDOORS THIS COMING SUNDAY

As I write this notice on Thursday 300 people are permitted to attend religious ceremonies outdoors. In last week's bulletin I mentioned the hope we have that there might be further positive developments announced by the State Government early in December. Now that it is Sunday, perhaps we are learning that a greater number can attend Mass outdoors. If this is the case, this will allow our Sunday Mass congregations to become more expansive, particularly for the parish Christmas Masses.

Thanks to the dedicated work of a small group of parishioners planning is well advanced for the celebration of Sunday Masses on the grounds of St. Kevin's School, beginning with Vigil Masses on Saturday, 12th and then Masses on Sunday, 13th December.

Mass times will be:

Saturday (12th): 5.00pm & 7.00pm

Sunday (13th): 8.00am & 10.00am

NO EVENING MASS due to the Christmas Carols at 5 pm.

The weather could prove troublesome! It is with the strength of the summer's heat in mind that the Masses on Sunday morning will be celebrated a little earlier. At the same time, it has been forecast that increased rain can be expected given the La Nina phase. Although the South East historically misses out. Nonetheless, it is probably a good idea to come prepared.

Volunteers Wanted

In preparation for moving to outdoor Sunday Masses, we require a number of volunteers per Mass to ensure COVID-safe standards are met. Volunteers are sought to assist at the 4 Masses on the 12th & 13th December [Saturday 5.00pm and 7.00pm; Sunday 8.00am and 10.00am].

Volunteers will be required to arrive 30 minutes prior to the scheduled Mass times and duties include helping people sign-in and directing parishioners to seating areas. Since volunteers are required during the mass, those who are serving as readers or Eucharistic ministers will not be able to volunteer when serving at that specific Mass.

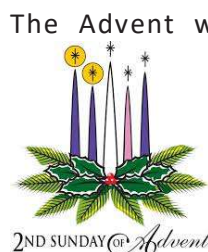
ADVENT

The meaning of the Season

During every Mass, immediately after the Our Father, the priest says a short prayer known as the embolism: "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ."

This prayer is particularly meaningful during Advent, the season where we consciously "await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ" with joyful expectation. This kind of waiting is often difficult, as joy and expectation do not generally characterize our everyday experience of waiting. Few of us are filled with hope as we sit in a traffic jam, stand at a bus stop, or experience delays when travelling by plane or train. We shop online and are willing to pay for guaranteed two-day (or overnight) delivery. We assume that Wi-Fi access will be fast and omnipresent-and we grow less patient when we have to wait for websites, audio, or video to load. Amid these everyday experiences, the Advent liturgies play a crucial role in teaching and reminding us how we ought to wait with joyful expectation. (Sourcebook)

The Advent Wreath



The Advent wreath is traditionally a circular garland of evergreen branches representing eternity. On that wreath, four or five candles are typically arranged, and during the season of Advent one candle on the wreath is lit each Sunday. Each candle represents an aspect of the spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus.

Bless us, Lord Jesus, in this season as we prepare to celebrate Christmas. We ask you to bless all in our family as we give thanks for all we have received. Open our hearts and minds to welcome you and help us to live in your peace. Amen

The office for Mission Renewal has produced a new resource: The Ready, Set, Pray!
