

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR B

FIRST READING – Jeremiah 31: 31-34

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah.

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, ‘Learn to know the Lord!’ No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

I tell you, most solemnly,
unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies,
it remains only a single grain;
but if it dies,
it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it;
anyone who hates his life in this world
will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me,
wherever I am, my servant will be there too.
If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.
Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.
Father, glorify your name!’

A voice came from heaven, ‘I have glorified it, and I will
glorify it again.’

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of
thunder; others said, ‘It was an angel speaking to him.’ Jesus
answered, ‘It was not for my sake that this voice came, but
for yours.

‘Now sentence is being passed on this world;
now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.
And when I am lifted up from the earth,
I shall draw all men to myself.’

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

Tuesday, 30th March, the Mass of the Holy Oils in St. Patrick’s Cathedral will be celebrated at 7.30pm. There will be Mass at 9.15am.

Holy Thursday: the Washing of the Feet (already optional) is to be omitted.

Good Friday:

At the conclusion of the Passion Play in the morning those attending will be welcome to go to the church to venerate the Cross. Those wishing to venerate the Cross will enter into the church, approach the Cross, venerate, and leave the church by one of the side doors. The Veneration of the Cross this Good Friday may be made by a simple bow or genuflection. The Cross is not to be reverenced with a kiss or by touching. For the Celebration of the Lord’s Passion at 3.00pm the number permitted in the church and the hall is limited. The (Government-) regulated capacity of both church and hall will be strictly monitored. It can be expected that there will be a sizeable number of people standing outside. The capacity of the church (& foyer), as well as the hall, will be reached on the basis of “First Come First Served”.

News from the Parish Pastoral Council...

The easing of COVID restrictions has enabled the PPC to meet in person for the first time in almost a year. In our February meeting, we discussed whether COVID has changed our direction. We agreed that our focus continues to be on building connections, enhancing communication, celebrating cultural diversity, supporting our youth in their faith journey, and adult faith development and education. A new matter arose – building community confidence that Mass is held in a COVID-safe way (i.e. hand sanitiser is available, social distancing marks appear on pews, and masks are worn by all in attendance).

In our March meeting, we workshopped concrete activities we can undertake to achieve our foci. In the next few months you will see the fruit of our workshop as we focus on implementing four activities, beginning with a mail-out to all parishioners that 'Church is back'! Parishioners will hear more about this in coming weeks as we seek assistance to carry out this task.
