Sunday Evening Mass Time Survey

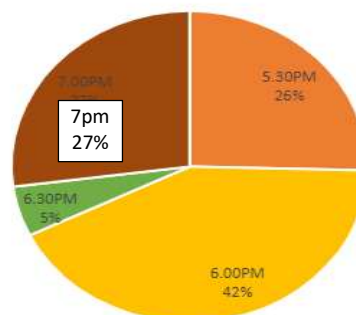
The survey in relation to the time of the Mass on Sunday evening has concluded. There were 656 responses. When considering all who participated in the survey the preferred Mass time indicates 42% for 6.00pm, 27% for 7.00pm, 26% for 5.30pm, and 5% for 6.30pm. Those who would regularly attend the 7.00pm Mass as well as those who sometimes attend at 7.00pm the first preference indicates 43% for 6.00pm, 28% for 7.00pm, 25% for 5.30pm, and 4% for 6.30pm. On behalf of St. Kevin's Parish, I gratefully acknowledge the careful, analytical work carried out by Francis Goh.

For the Mass of the Lord’s Supper you are welcome to bring your Project Compassion boxes, etc. to be included in the Procession of Gifts to the altar.

Good Friday:

At the conclusion of the Passion Play in the morning those attending will be welcome to go to the church to venerate the Cross. Those wishing to venerate the Cross will enter into the church, approach the Cross, venerate, and leave the church by one of the side doors. The Veneration of the Cross this Good Friday may be made by a simple bow or genuflection. The Cross is not to be revered with a kiss or by touching. For the Celebration of the Lord’s Passion at 3.00pm the number permitted in the church and the hall is limited. The (Government-) regulated capacity of both church and hall will be strictly monitored. The capacity of the church (& foyer), as well as the hall, will be reached on the basis of “First Come First Served”.
