FIRST READING – Deuteronomy 4: 32-34, 39-40

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth. Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any God ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors - all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

Seating in the church –

Provision for individuals with special needs and/or particular disabilities, and carers

A meeting during the week of Sacristans and three other parishioners discussed the question of the accommodation in the church of persons with special needs. The intent prompting the discussion of such a question was to try and ensure that persons with special needs are included in the maximum number permitted within the church in light of the current restrictions.

Outcomes:

- up to 6 seats are to be available at each Sunday Mass (inc. the Vigil Masses). It was noted that, for those with special needs, it can be a struggle just to come to Mass and be on time. Therefore, these seats are to be kept open and available. The maximum number now allowed within the main area of the church is 248, and not 254 (the availability of 30 seats in the foyer continues).
- these 6 seats also allow for any carers, and provide the option to be seated at the front (near to the Sanctuary) as well as at the back (in the tiled area near the font). These seats may be regularised as 2 seats at the front, whether for 2 wheelchairs or 2 other seats, and 4 at the back. There may be, however, some flexibility with regard to the numbers at the front and the back. It was noted that some parishioners who use a walking frame opt to sit elsewhere in the church. In these instances, the Sacristans are aware and alert the priest celebrant and/or an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist for the purpose of bringing Communion to the person(s).
- those who are uppermost in mind, though not exclusively, are persons in wheelchairs or with walking aids, the frail aged, and pregnant women.
- the Sacristans endeavour to be alert to persons with special needs to offer assistance, and are also receptive to requests to give assistance to them.

I am grateful to all those who have been part of this important process for our parish community.

Update from the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne:

As of 11.59 pm, Thursday 27th May 2021, the following 'circuit breaker lockdown' Measures will apply across Victoria and will be in place until 11.59 pm, Thursday 3rd June 2021, unless otherwise notified.

Face masks must be worn inside and outdoors: everywhere except your own home.

There will be 5 reasons to leave home:

- Shopping for necessary goods and services;
- Caregiving or compassionate reasons;
- Authorised work or permitted education
- Exercise (up to 2 hours within 5 kms)
- Receive a vaccination

Private and public gatherings will not be permitted.

Prayer and religious ceremonies: No in-person gatherings permitted. Livestreaming and Broadcast is permitted with a total of 5 people present including technicians.

Funerals: (indoor and outdoor) Permitted with no more than 10 people (and those necessary to conduct the funeral).

Weddings: (indoor and outdoor) Not permitted unless under special circumstances.

Aged Care: No visitors are permitted into aged care or other residential facility settings.

Hospitals: No visitors are permitted into health care settings.
