And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.’

‘Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.

### Updated Liturgical Guidelines:

These Guidelines are intended to assist in the reverent and joyful celebration of Holy Mass while maintaining the health and safety precautions offered through health and government authorities.

- It is encouraged that face coverings be worn indoors.
- Communicants are only to receive the Host, there is to be no sharing of the Chalice.
- Minister sanitises hands before beginning distribution.
- Sanitiser stations should be made available for communicants and encouragement given to safe distancing in approaching for reception.

Bookings are still required for Thursday morning and Saturday 5pm Vigil Masses since both are for 'unknown vaccination status'. For these Masses there is a maximum cap of 50.
