

## THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR B

### FIRST READING – 1 Kings 17: 10-16

#### A reading from the first Book of Kings

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent,  
jug of oil shall not be emptied,  
before the day when the Lord sends  
rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

#### A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is

not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

### GOSPEL – Mark 12: 38-44

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

In his teaching Jesus said, 'Beware of the scribes who like to walk about in long robes, to be greeted obsequiously in the market squares, to take the front seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets; these are the men who swallow the property of widows, while making a show of lengthy prayers. The more severe will be the sentence they receive.'

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the treasury, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, this poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on.'

#### Let's reflect...

*I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they all contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, her whole living. "*

Please give at least 6 months notification prior to a wedding at our Church. If an annulment is involved, we will require at least a year's notice for the annulment process to take place. Please call or email the Parish Office.

### New Government requirements

The Victorian government has set out requirements related to vaccinations and the dates October 15<sup>th</sup> & November 26<sup>th</sup>. It will be necessary for authorised workers to provide proof of vaccinations to the Parish Priest.

## Updated Guidelines with Changes in Mass Time

Following the easing of Victorian Government restrictions St. Kevin's Church is now open for public Masses.

The density quotient of 1 person per 4 sqm allows for up to 142 persons in the church. This number includes the clergy, sacristan, and two persons with special needs.

After careful consideration, the following decision has been made, that Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday Masses are reserved only for those who have been **fully vaccinated** (double vaccinated, have an official medical exemption or under 16's).

As an exception, the Thursday 9:15am and Saturday 5pm Mass, will be exclusively reserved for those with an **'unknown vaccination status'**.

**No booking required for the weekday Masses except for every Thursday due to very limited availability (30).** The link for the Thursday Masses in the month of November is: <https://www.trybooking.com/BVEGD>

**However bookings will be required for all the weekend Masses.**

The Try Booking link for the weekend of 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> November which will be open from the 7<sup>th</sup> November is: <https://www.trybooking.com/BVJEQ>

Weekday Masses will be at the usual times (please refer to the Parish Calendar).

All Masses will be for those with the fully vaccinated status **except on Thursdays 9.15am and Saturday Vigil 5pm**, which will be for those with 'unknown vaccination status'.


On arrival, **everyone** will need to check-in via the QR code and show proof of vaccination to the Covid Check-in Marshal (digital certificate on the phone or hard copy). Anyone over 16 years old needs to have proof of full vaccination or exemption. Entry will be refused, if you are unable to provide proof of full vaccination status. Also face-masks must be worn, unless lawfully exempt. Sanitizing and social distancing are mandatory.

**Please arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass starts as the Church doors will be locked once Mass begins.**
