Celebrating Diocesan World Youth Day in our Parish

‘Stand up. I appoint you as a witness of what
you have seen.’ —ACTS 26:16

Dear young friends last year Pope Francis moved the annual celebration of World Youth Day from Palm Sunday to the Feast of Christ the King. In observance of this Diocesan World Youth Day in our parish coming **Saturday 20th November at 7:00 pm**, we will have a **youth Mass, followed by Holy Hour and Benediction** led by our young people. All are welcome to attend, but we especially request the young people of our parish to attend this Mass and spend time with Jesus in the Holy Hour. Come let us celebrate this Feast of Christ the King and Diocesan World Youth Day together.

Updated Guidelines with Changes in Mass Time

Following the easing of Victorian Government restrictions St. Kevin's Church is now open for public Masses.

The density quotient of 1 person per 4 sqm allows for up to 142 persons in the church. This number includes the clergy, sacristan, and two persons with special needs.

After careful consideration, the following decision has been made, that Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday Masses are reserved only for those who have been **fully vaccinated** (double vaccinated, have an official medical exemption or under 16's).

As an exception, the Thursday 9:15am and Saturday 5pm Mass, will be reserved exclusively for those with an **‘unknown vaccination status’**.

Please arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass starts as the Church doors will be locked once Mass begins.

Please note: All the parents or guardians of the child/children must sign in and sign out on the sheet provided on the training days. If any parent is not fully vaccinated you will not be able to remain inside the church. Please arrive by 2:45 pm at the church.

Due to the Victorian Law and archdiocesan guidelines all those above 16-years must be fully vaccinated to attend this training and have proof of vaccination.

Proposed Bill a 'serious overreach': Archbishop Comensoli

Archbishop Peter A Comensoli has written to all members of the Melbourne Catholic community expressing grave concerns about the State Government's proposed new legislation, the *Equal Opportunity (Religious Exceptions) Amendment Bill 2021*. In the letter, the Archbishop explains that the proposed changes will significantly impact all faith-based organisations in Victoria who will no longer be able to employ staff who hold the same religious beliefs and values unless they can prove that it is an 'inherent requirement' of the job. Month of November 'Month of Holy Souls'

Dear friends, the month of November is set aside to remember our deceased loved ones and pray for their eternal salvation. Throughout November, please remember to pray for your deceased family members & friends. We love them and we will always remember them with our prayers, especially at Holy Mass.

This year the Pope has granted a Plenary Indulgence to anyone who prays in a cemetery for the repose of souls. A Plenary Indulgence is the removal of all the temporal punishment due our sin. Essentially it is about removing the purification time in purgatory. To receive a Plenary Indulgence, one has to pray for the intentions of the Pope's spiritual leadership, pray an Our Father and Creed, receive the Sacraments of Confession and Eucharist and most importantly be detached from a desire to sin. With these conditions being met, anyone who visits a cemetery to pray for the dead, on any day in November, receives the Plenary Indulgence. This is meant to be seen and experienced as a gift for us personally as we receive Communion, confession and time of prayer and of course a gift for any souls in purgatory whom the Lord welcomes into the eternal kingdom.

Pope's November Prayer Intention: We pray that people who suffer from depression or burn-out will find support and a light that opens them up to life.
