WORLD YOUTH SUNDAY 2021 THEME:

WITNESS



This year, Pope Francis has declared that the worldwide Church will celebrate World Youth Day every year, on the Sunday before Advent. This is also the Feast of Christ the King! This is a reminder that Jesus is King, and that as daughters and sons of God – we are born royalty too! Jesus was a servant king, the best example to us of how to love one another. “Young friends, don’t wait until tomorrow to contribute your energy, your audacity and your creativity to changing our world. Your youth is not an “in-between time”. You are the now of God.” (Pope Francis)

Jesus calls to be a positive change in the world which comes from the recognition that we have purpose and we are appointed. (Acts 26:16) These words are those of Jesus to Paul, then Saul, on the road to Damascus – but they are also words of Jesus to us, wherever we are on our life’s path.

Updated Guidelines:

No Bookings required for Fully Vaccinated status Mass:

Following the Premier’s announcement regarding the further easing of restrictions, from November 19, bookings are no longer required to attend Mass at St Kevin’s (with the exception of Thursday morning and Saturday 5pm Vigil).

All Masses will be for those with the fully vaccinated status (i.e. double vaccinated, have an official medical exemption or under 12’s) except on Thursdays 9.15am and Saturday Vigil 5pm, which will be for those of ‘unknown vaccination status’.

On arrival, everyone is still required to check-in via the QR code and show proof of vaccination to the Covid Check-in Marshall (digital certificate on the phone or hard copy).

Proof of FULLY vaccinated status and QR Code check-in is required each time you attend ‘fully vaccinated status’ Mass.

Anyone over 12 years old needs to have proof of full vaccination or exemption. Entry will be refused if you are unable to provide proof of full vaccination status.

Weekday and Weekend Sunday Mass times remain unchanged. There is no density cap but you are encouraged to wear the face masks inside the church.

Bookings are still required for Thursday morning and Saturday 5pm Vigil Masses since both are for ‘unknown vaccination status’.

For these Masses there is a maximum cap of 50.

Please continue to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled Mass to ensure Check in and Vaccination checks are completed in a timely manner. Doors will be closed at the commencement of Mass.

**THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST,
KING OF THE UNIVERSE (CHRIST THE KING)**

This weekend the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Christ the King). This feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. The feast is intended to proclaim in an effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

"This kingdom is spiritual and is concerned with spiritual things. That this is so the above quotations from Scripture amply prove, and Christ by his own action confirms it. On many occasions, when the Jews and even the Apostles wrongly supposed that the Messiah would restore the liberties and the kingdom of Israel, he repelled and denied such a suggestion. When the populace thronged around him in admiration and would have acclaimed him King, he shrank from the honor and sought safety in flight. Before the Roman magistrate he declared that his kingdom was not of this world. The gospels present this kingdom as one which men prepare to enter by penance, and cannot actually enter except by faith and by baptism, which, though an external rite, signifies and produces an interior regeneration. This kingdom is opposed to none other than to that of Satan and to the power of darkness. It demands of its subjects a spirit of detachment from riches and earthly things, and a spirit of gentleness. They must hunger and thirst after justice, and more than this, they must deny themselves and carry the cross. Christ as our Redeemer purchased the Church at the price of his own blood; as priest he offered himself, and continues to offer himself as a victim for our sins." (Pope Pius XI *Quas Primas On The Feast Of Christ The King*)
