A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book,
'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the
Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the
sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the
sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them;
and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey
your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it
with the second. And this will was for us to be made
holy by the offering of his body made once and for all
by Jesus Christ.

On Saturday mornings from 9.45 until 10:30 am.


BAPTISMS

Reflecting on Take the Way of the Gospel

When Fr Des asked me to attend an archdiocesan meeting about a new process that Archbishop Peter wanted to present to the people of Melbourne, I didn't know what to expect. As I sat with 200+ other lay leaders in May 2021, I listened with interest that turned to scepticism and even concern. We were being invited, as our clergy had been a few weeks prior, to open our minds and hearts to a way of renewing and reinvigorating our parishes, but all I could hear was what sounded like a way of dealing with the shortage of priests. What did this new process mean to us at St Kevin's?

Soon after that meeting, Fr Des asked me if I would be a St K's representative for CAM meetings. After prayer and pondering, I accepted. In the 6 months since that first meeting in Bulleen, I have changed my mind! I am now excited and eager to see TWG implemented in our parish community. What's changed?

After attending 4 or 5 meetings with the Archdiocesan Mission Team, I've learned so much more about the Archbishop's vision. After reading through 10+ years of Council of Priests Meetings' minutes, he found some themes emerging that concerned him, such as the decreasing number of people attending Mass, engaging with the sacraments, being involved in parish life, and a fear of what lies ahead for the Catholic church at large. He turned for inspiration to Pope Francis' encyclical 'Evangelii Gaudium' and to Archbishop James Goold, Melbourne's first Archbishop. After much discernment, he landed upon a process that we now know as Take the Way of the Gospel (TWG). This process invites all of us to reflect on the work we are doing in our parishes - how we evangelise, engage, reach out to and embrace all peoples in our communities, not just parishioners. And how to best utilise the resources and gifts of neighbouring parishes.

I've come to accept and embrace TWG. I now see that there is much we need to question about how we live out the Gospel call if we are to grow and renew our parishes. TWG is not about amalgamating parishes or increasing the workload of our clergy; the Archbishop has been very clear about that. TWG is about reinvigorating, re-energising and better resourcing our parishes. It's about helping us to "open our doors to the flock", as Pope Francis said in his encyclical.

In the New Year, we will begin the dialogue in our parish. Over several months, meetings and workshops will be held, providing opportunities for us to share thoughts and ideas on what we can do at St Kevin's. Everyone is encouraged to participate for, as Oscar Romero said, "If I don't listen to the people, I am not listening to the Spirit."

To get the ball rolling, you are encouraged to visit the TWG website and have a read. An email account will be established specifically for TWG to enable parishioners to share their thoughts and opinions. It's important to note that TWG is not 'a done deal'. Archbishop Peter encourages us to take up TWG but we are not mandated to take part.

This is an exciting time for the Melbourne church. Let's embrace it and pray for its success.
