

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C

FIRST READING – Isaiah 6: 1-8

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings.

And they cried out one to another in this way,
'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts.
His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out,
and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said:
'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost,
for I am a man of unclean lips
and I live among a people of unclean lips,
and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said:

'See now, this has touched your lips,
your sin is taken away,
your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying:
'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?'
I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

SECOND READING – 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians

Brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel

will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas & secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

GOSPEL – Luke 5: 1-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats - it was Simon's - and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boats to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.' Then bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

HEALING PRAYER AT BEDTIME



Take the Way of the Gospel ... our parish discernment continues

Last week, we began Phase 1 of our discernment process. Parishioners were invited to take home a copy of Archbishop Comensoli's 2021 Pentecost letter in which he writes about the TWG process. This week we continue reflecting on matters regarding our overarching theme of Missionary Parishes.

For pondering this week...

Developing Discipleship: A disciple is defined as a follower of a teacher, leader, or philosopher. In the Christian sense, a disciple is someone who follows the life and teachings of Jesus. The word 'disciple' is mentioned more than 250 times in the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. For Jesus' message to take hold and multiply, disciples were needed. They shared the message of Jesus with others. His disciples were key to ensuring Jesus' message didn't die with him on the cross.

In 2022, as we ponder what it is to be Missionary Parishes, we face the challenge of growing as missionary disciples. True discipleship is missionary in nature, and vital to the mission that is St. Kevin's Parish. The Gospel shows us that Jesus sent out his disciples to bring others into discipleship. To be missionary disciples St. Kevin's will be a parish with vitality.

Consider the following:

- How do we support each other to continually develop our personal experience of following Jesus?
- Do we, at St Kevin's, actively encourage discipleship? How?
- At St Kevin's, what more can we do to ensure we continually strive for all of us to fulfil the call to be missionary followers of Jesus?
