

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C

FIRST READING – 1 Samuel 26: 2. 7-9,12-13,22-23

A reading from the first book of Samuel

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

GOSPEL – Luke 6: 27-38

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.'

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'



Take the Way of the Gospel... Week 4

This week we turn our attention more fully to 'mission'. Many Christians think that our missionary work occurs because we are responding to requests made to us when we attend a church service. But it is the other way round. Jesus had a mission long before the church was established, hence the well known saying 'The mission has a church.' This is something worth pondering at any time but is more important now as we reflect on the future of our church communities.

After he had spent 40 days in the wilderness, Jesus set out on a mission to bring the good news to all peoples. The good news is many things - the unconditional love of God, his merciful forgiveness, the unshakeable promise that every person is worthwhile, the compassionate heart of God made visible in the heart of Jesus - the list goes on.

The purpose of establishing Missionary parishes is to reignite our parishes to fulfil the mission. We remember the saying 'Jesus has no hands but your hands.' It is up to us to continue working to spread the Gospel message, the good news of God's love. To do that, we need to re-energise and revitalise our parishes to make sure they are viable and so be self-supporting as well as connected and working with other parishes. To do that, we need to develop evangelisers, and to do that we need to have true disciples who know the love of God first hand and who want to spread that good news more actively and consciously than ever before.

Fulfilling the mission and ensuring St. Kevin's Parish remains viable is a huge task and will not be completed in our lifetime but we must put our heads together and do our part.
