The celebration of the Triduum is the heart of the liturgical year. It is possibly true that many Catholics have never experienced the Sacred Paschal Triduum in its entirety, as it was meant to be prayed, that is, as one continuous rite – or even as the individual components of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. The annual celebration of these Great Three Days holds some of the fondest memories of Church, of ritual and singing.

Palm Sunday: the principal Mass is at 11.00am with a procession from outside the church.

Holy Thursday: please bring your Project Compassion offerings to the church so that these can be brought forward to the altar as a sign of St. Kevin's gifts for the poor. You can donate through Project Compassion donation boxes and envelopes available from your Parish, by visiting lent.caritas.org.au, or by calling 1800 024 413

Good Friday Collection:

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on April 15th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from this collection. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus.

of Planned-Giving in St. Kevin's Parish

A Renewal Programme for parish planned-giving has been scheduled for post-Easter: late April, May and June. This upcoming Renewal Programme gives St. Kevin's Parish the chance to pick up the traces of where we have been and re-set ourselves for the future.

➤ The Vision Project Team sought feedback via a questionnaire. I received the feedback on 18th February, 2020. While the number of participants was low, in response to the question, How do you rate the overall appearance of our present Parish Centre? 50% gave a rating of Poor, 35% Fair, and 15% Good. Most of those who participated in the survey had ideas and suggestions about the main thing they would like to see in connection with a new Parish Centre, such as a pleasing and welcoming ambience and a hall that could be sub-divided for smaller groups.

Today, at our Sunday Masses, Census Cards will be distributed and collected. Completion of census cards will assist towards the Renewal Programme and the updating of parish records.

A most important date in programme's Calendar of Dates and Events is the **Parish Information Meeting** on Tuesday, 31st May in the Hall at 7.30pm.
