individual entry the cost is up to \$49 per individual, but if you book
in a group, it comes down to \$16 per adult and \$10.50 per child.
We will be making a booking for the entire group to enter Mt. Buller
village so you do not have to purchase entry tickets. Just pay the

DO YOU KNOW WHAT EPICLESIS IS?

Epiclesis is the invocation of the Holy Spirit during Mass, when the priest says this prayer at the time of consecration of bread and wine, while we kneel.

EPICLESIS: The prayer petitioning God to send the Holy Spirit so that the offerings at the Eucharist may become the Body and Blood of Christ and thus the faithful, by receiving them, may themselves become a living offering to God. In every sacrament the prayer asking for the sanctifying power of God's Holy Spirit is an "epiclesis".

(1105, 1127 Catechism of the Catholic Church)

How important is the Eucharist for the Church?

The celebration of the Eucharist is the heart of the Christian communion. In it the Church becomes Church. {1325}

We are not the Church because we get along well, or because we happen to end up in the same parish community, but rather because in the Eucharist we receive the Body of Christ and increasingly being transformed into the Body of Christ. (126, 217) *Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church (YOUCAT)*

Pope St Paul VI, *Mysterium Fidei* 50 (1965)

When the faithful adore Christ present in the sacrament they should remember that this presence derives from the sacrifice and is directed toward both sacramental and spiritual communion.

Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.’ Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death.

GOSPEL – Luke 9: 11-17

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, ‘Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.’ He replied, ‘Give them something to eat yourselves.’ But they said, ‘We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.’ For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, ‘Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.’ They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.
