Latest Updated Guidelines:

The most recent Government announcement regarding further relaxation of COVID related restrictions has, as usual, prompted an updating of Liturgical Guidelines approved by the Archbishop. Included are the following details:

- Face coverings remain optional within Places of Worship, workplaces, primary schools, early childhood or retail settings.
- There are no longer vaccination requirements at Places of Worship nor any requirements for organisers to check vaccination status for attendee, workers or volunteers at Places of Worship and for associated parish activities.
- Holy Communion may be distributed to the faithful under both species (i.e., the Sacred Host and Precious Blood). *This means that in St Kevin's Parish Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be offered both species. In addition, there will be the resumption of the Offertory Procession.*
- Sanitising hands before distribution of Holy Communion is still recommended.

Celebrating 175 years of our diocesan family of faith

On Sunday 26 June, at St Patrick's Cathedral, the people of God gathered from across the Archdiocese for a Mass to celebrate the 175th anniversary of the establishment of the Diocese of Melbourne. The unity and diversity of Melbourne's 'family of faith' were both clearly on display at the cathedral as it resounded with song and the prayers of the gathered faithful. Archbishop Peter A. Comensoli celebrated the Mass and was joined by the Dean of the Cathedral, Very Rev. Werner Utri, as concelebrant.

A highlight of the Mass was the launch of a specially commissioned Mass setting, arranged by Dr. Philip Matthais, Director of Music at the cathedral. Jointly commissioned by St Patrick's and St Paul's Cathedrals, the setting has been used to mark the 175th anniversaries of both the Catholic and Anglican dioceses of Melbourne, which were established on the same day on 25 June 1847. Entitled *Melbourne Mass-One Family in Christ*, it draws on the cultural and musical heritage of various ethnic communities who have helped shape our life together as a family of faith, including Aboriginal people, Torres Strait Islanders, Irish, Vietnamese, Tongans, Filipinos and Croatians.

Celebrating 175 years of our diocesan family of faith (cont.)

On the evening of Sunday 26 June, representatives of the Catholic Archdiocese and Anglican Diocese of Melbourne came together to celebrate Choral Evensong at St Paul's Cathedral and to mark a shared anniversary: 175 years since both dioceses were established on 25 June 1847—the day that the City of Melbourne also officially came into being.

Archbishop Peter A Comensoli, Very Rev. Werner Utri, Dean of St. Patrick's Cathedral and other members of Melbourne's Catholic community joined Archbishop Philip Frier, Very Rev Andreas Loewe, Dean of St Paul's Cathedral, bishops and deans from across the Anglican Province of Victoria and many from the broader Anglican community to participate in the evening liturgy of the Anglican daily office, commonly referred to as 'Evensong' – a meditative and beautiful service of sung prayer. GOSPEL – Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.' The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said, 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'
