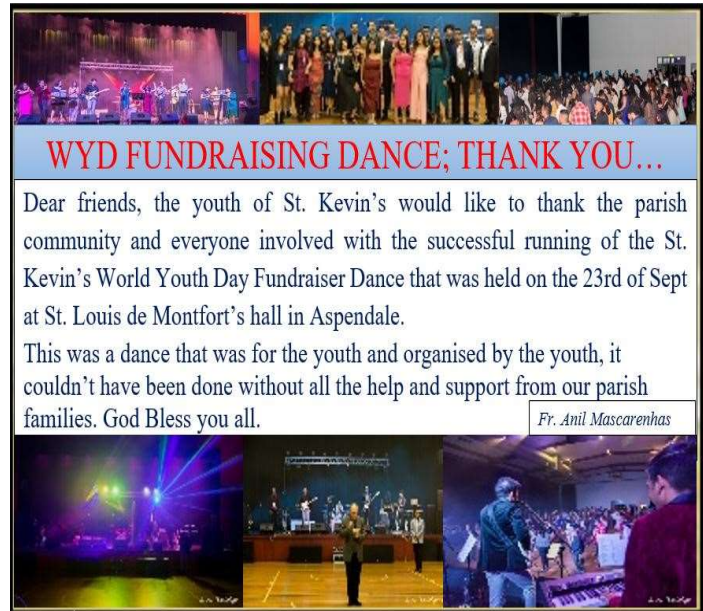

## Arising from the recent Formation sessions

Reference was made during the Formation for Ministries (Readers & Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) meetings to a point concerning **Gestures and Bodily Posture** as found in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*.

In Chapter III of the *Instruction* it is stated that in the celebration of the Mass the faithful form a holy people, a people of God's own possession, and take care to show this by their deep religious sense and their charity toward brothers and sisters who participate with them in the same celebration. They are consequently to avoid any appearance of singularity or division, keeping in mind that they have only one Father in heaven and that hence are all brothers or sisters one to the other. [95] Moreover, they are to form one body, ... This unity is beautifully apparent from the gestures and bodily postures observed together by the faithful. [96]

It is pointed out in Chapter II that: A common bodily posture, to be observed by all those taking part, is a sign of the unity of the members of the Christian community gathered together for the Sacred Liturgy, for it expresses the intentions and spiritual attitude of the participants and also fosters them. [42]

Gerard Moore in his book, *Understanding The General Instruction of The Roman Missal*, writes: The gestures and postures of the members of the assembly, ordained and lay faithful, are not a question of private inclination or arbitrary choice. Rather, they are related to the directives of the *Instruction* and the traditional practices of the Roman Rite, in light of the pastoral orientation that comes from being attentive to the common spiritual good of the faithful [42].

## THE TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C

### FIRST READING – 2 Kings 5: 14-17

#### A reading from the second book of the Kings

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

#### A reading from the second letter of St. Paul to Timothy

Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal - but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it.

If we have died with him, then we shall live with him.

If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him.  
If we disown him, then he will disown us.  
We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful,  
for he cannot disown his own self.

### GOSPEL – Luke 17: 11-19

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
