November 1st - Feast of All Saints:

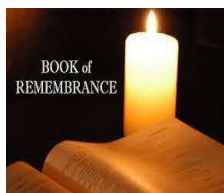
On November 1, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. On this day, we rejoice with the Church Triumphant, those men and women who have lived lives in imitation of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and are now united with Him in the Communion of Saints.

As they have lived lives imitating Christ, their lives become models for us as they always point us to Christ. And, as even death cannot separate us in Jesus Christ (Romans 8:38-39), we even now remain united to our brothers and sisters in the Lord through the Mystical Body of Christ, which is the Church. United to the Saints through Christ, we find in these righteous men and women powerful intercessors on our behalf (James 5:16). Just as we so often turn to our brothers and sisters here on earth in times of need, we are also called to turn to our heavenly brothers and sisters.

We can ask for their intercessory prayer on our behalf to our heavenly Father and our Lord, Jesus Christ. And, as we gather together to worship God through the Holy Mass, we are united with this great cloud of witnesses (Hebrews 12:1) in a special way.

At Mass, the entire Body of Christ, in heaven and earth, unite in one voice of praise to our heavenly Father as we offer the singular sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis says of November 1st (All Saints Day) — “The Feast of All Saints reminds us that the goal of our existence is not death, it is Paradise. During their earthly existence, the saints lived in profound communion with God. In the face of the humblest, and least of our brothers (and sisters), the smallest and most despised brothers (and sisters) they saw the face of God, and now they contemplate Him face to face in His glorious beauty.”



**NOVEMBER: THE MONTH OF THE HOLY
SOULS
BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE**

The church reminds us, particularly in November, to pray for those who have died. Here at St. Kevin's you are invited to write the names of your deceased family members and friends in the Parish Book of Remembrance, which will be left at the foot of the altar during November. Our family members and friends will be remembered as each Mass is celebrated. Reference will be made in the Prayer of the Faithful, as we pray for the names in the November Book of Remembrance. This is the Communion of Saints at work!

This will mean that our usual custom of presenting names for anniversaries in the Bulletin will be suspended in November since they can be in the Book of Remembrance, with the exception of those who have died recently. Once names of our beloved deceased have been entered into this Book there is no need to enter the names again.

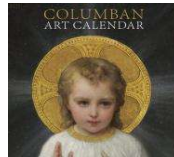

GOSPEL – Luke 19: 1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor' and if I have cheated anybody I will pay him back four times the amount' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'
