**More Appointments by the Archbishop**

Last week, St. Kevin's received the news of Fr. Anil's appointment as Assistant Director of Vocations in the Archdiocese of Melbourne while he continues as Assistant Priest at St. Kevin's. There is news this week of additional appointments made by the Archbishop.

**Clergy Life & Ministry (Ongoing Formation) – Rev Desmond Moloney PP**

The Archbishop has appointed **Rev Desmond Moloney PP** as a member of the Clergy Life and Ministry Office responsible for ongoing formation. This appointment will take effect on 19 April 2023 and will be in addition to his new appointment (as from 31 May 2023) as Parish Priest of Ascot Vale Parish.

This is an official communication that spells out I have received an appointment as coordinator of Ongoing Formation of Clergy, which has led to my appointment as Parish Priest of St. Mary's Parish, Ascot Vale. My role connected to the ongoing formation of clergy will begin on the 19<sup>th</sup> April. Therefore, the 19<sup>th</sup> April will be my departure day from St. Kevin's Parish. As shown above, I will begin as Parish Priest of Ascot Vale on the 31<sup>st</sup> May.

I appreciate this may come as something of a 'bombshell' for parishioners here, and so time is probably needed to process developments such as these. For me, the Archbishop's call came unexpectedly since I saw myself continuing as your Parish Priest for some time to come. I am reminded that in the spirit of surrender and trust in God that surprises tend to come our way. A Jesuit priest, Gerard Hughes, gives this message with his book entitled, "God of Surprises". There will be more to be said in the time remaining as we are able to reflect in light of such surprising and unexpected twists and turns. This is a time for prayer, adding to our prayer in this Lenten season, praying for what God would want in the outcome of a new Parish Priest for St. Kevin's Parish.

### *(Gospel continued)*

'What do you want from her?' or, 'Why are you talking to her?' The woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town to tell the people, 'Come and see a man who has told me everything I ever did; I wonder if he is the Christ?' This brought people out of the town and they started walking towards him.

Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, 'Rabbi, do have something to eat;' but he said, 'I have food to eat that you do not know about.' So the disciples asked one another, 'Has someone been bringing him food?' But Jesus said:

'My food is to do the will of the one who sent me, and to complete his work. Have you not got a saying: Four months and then the harvest? Well, I tell you: Look around you, look at the fields; already they are white, ready for harvest! Already the reaper is being paid his wages, already he is bringing in the grain for eternal life, and thus sower and reaper rejoice together. For here the proverb holds good: one sows, another reaps; I sent you to reap a harvest you had not worked for. Others worked for it; and you come into the rewards of their trouble.'

Many Samaritans of that town had believed in him on the strength of the woman's testimony when she said, 'He told me all I have ever done.' So, when the Samaritans came up to him, they begged him to stay with them. He stayed for two days, and when he spoke to them many more came to believe; and they said to the woman, 'Now we no longer believe because of what you told us; we have heard him ourselves and we know that he really is the saviour of the world.'

## THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR A

### FIRST READING – Exodus 17: 3-7

#### A reading from the book of Exodus.

Tormented by thirst, the people complained against Moses. ‘Why did you bring us out of Egypt?’ they said. ‘Was it so that I should die of thirst, my children too, and my cattle?’ Moses appealed to the Lord. ‘How am I to deal with this people?’ he said. ‘A little more and they will stone me!’ The Lord said to Moses, ‘Take with you some of the elders of Israel and move to the forefront of the people; take in your hand the staff with which you struck the river, and go. I shall be standing before you there on the rock, at Horeb. You must strike the rock, and water will flow from it for the people to drink.’ This is what Moses did, in the sight of the elders of Israel. The place was named Massah and Meribah because of the grumbling of the sons of Israel and because they put the Lord to the test by saying, ‘Is the Lord with us, or not?’

### SECOND READING – Romans 5: 1-2, 5-8

#### A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God’s glory. This hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man – though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners.

### GOSPEL – John 4: 5-42

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus came to the Samaritan town called Sychar, near the land Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Jacob’s well is there and Jesus, tired by the journey, sat straight down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, ‘Give me a drink.’ His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, ‘What? You are a Jew and you ask me, a Samaritan, for a drink?’ – Jews, in fact, do not associate with Samaritans. Jesus replied: If you only knew what God is offering and who it is that is saying to you: Give me a drink, you would have been the one to ask, and he would have given you living water.

‘You have no bucket, sir,’ she answered ‘and the well is deep: how could you get this living water? Are you a greater man than our father Jacob who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his sons and his cattle?’ Jesus replied: ‘Whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again; but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water I shall give will turn into a spring inside him, welling up to eternal life.’

‘Sir,’ said the woman, ‘give me some of that water, so that I may never get thirsty and never have to come here again to draw water.’ Go and call your husband’ said Jesus to her ‘and come back here.’ The woman answered, ‘I have no husband.’ He said to her, ‘You are right to say, “I have no husband”; for although you have had five, the one you have now is not your husband. You spoke the truth there.’ ‘I see you are a prophet, sir’ said the woman. ‘Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, while you say that Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship.’ Jesus said: ‘Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know; for salvation comes from the Jews. But the hour will come – in fact it is here already – when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth: that is the kind of worshipper the Father wants. God is spirit, and those who worship must worship in spirit and truth.’

The woman said to him, ‘I know that Messiah – that is, Christ – is coming; and when he comes he will tell us everything.’ ‘I who am speaking to you,’ said Jesus ‘I am he.’

At this point his disciples returned, and were surprised to find him speaking to a woman, though none of them asked,
