Peter's Pence Collection – next weekend

Peter's Pence (or *Denarii Sancti Petri* and "Alms of St Peter") are donations or payments made directly to the Holy See of the Catholic church. The practice began under the Saxons in England and spread through Europe. Today, Peter's Pence is support offered by the faithful to the Holy Father as a sign of their sharing in the concern of the Successor of Peter for the many different needs of the Universal Church and for the relief of those most in need.

St Peter's Pence Day takes place on the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, or on the closest Sunday this year 25 June. Every one of us is invited to make a contribution to the Church through your local parish during Mass at this time.

Saint Peter (died between AD 64 and 68 on the Vatican Hill) also known as Peter the Apostle, Peter the Rock, Simon Peter, Simeon, Simon or Cephas, was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus Christ and one of the first leaders of the early church. Based on contemporary historical data, his papacy is estimated to have spanned from AD 30 to his death, which would make him the longest-reigning pope, at anywhere from 34 to 38 years, however, the length of his reign was never verified.

The Month of June has solemnities of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Both the Solemnities remind us of the humanity and divinity of Jesus. With Jesus' divinity, the Most Holy Trinity is revealed and celebrated. Furthermore, we have the Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist and Saints Peter and Paul. Rarely so many Solemnities are celebrated in one month. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us to have the centrality of the Eucharist in our lives. Let us develop the Eucharistic Consciousness. May the Eucharistic Lord give us a true shape according to his Heart.

Corpus Christi celebrations

Several dioceses across Australia held Eucharistic processions that lined the streets of the country's capital cities. In Melbourne, Corpus Christi college, the regional seminary of the dioceses in Victoria and Tasmania, hosted a string of events across the weekend under the theme: 'Bringing Christ to the Streets'. The activities included an outreach to the homeless, an open lunch for the neighbourhood, a visit to Justin Villa to spend time with retired priests, reflections by past students on the Eucharist, and a Solemn Mass and Eucharistic procession on Sunday afternoon.

Sunday's Eucharistic celebration was attended by more than 700 people, filling Sacred Heart Church, with more joining the procession that followed

FIRST READING – Exodus 19: 2-6

A reading from the Book of Exodus

From Rephidim the Israelites set out again; and when they reached the wilderness of Sinai, there in the wilderness they pitched their camp; there facing the mountain Israel pitched the camp.

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans

We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man – though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die – but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through who we have already gained our reconciliation.

GOSPEL – Matthew 9: 36-10: 8

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows:

'Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.'

Let's Reflect.....

"As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'" Matthew 10:7

Many of us take our lives for granted. We think we have plenty of time to "repent." Maybe we should live with a little more urgency in making things right with God. This is the difference in living our discipleship out of obligation versus out of love. Obligation implies we do the minimum required. Love implies we want a relationship. God wants us to be with Him in Heaven forever, but He also wants to be in relationship with us right now, while we are on earth. Start this second – invite the Lord into your heart.
