News from Fr Fabian

- As part of our fundraising efforts, we are collecting cans and bottles that give a 10c refund each. We are also putting a box in front of the sanctuary to drop loose change. To make our fundraising efforts fun, we are asking that a parishioner or two match the collection amount raised each month and the Parish will put in a similar amount. For example, if we raise \$100 in loose change and \$100 in recycling and someone matches each of these amounts, it will give us a total of \$400. The Parish will match the amount, which will bring the total to \$800.
- As it will cost us \$200,000 for the building of the Chapel and \$100,000 for the grotto we are trying every effort to raise funds through your generous contributions. To this end, we will have a special collection on the first weekend of every month towards fundraising for the Grotto. On the third weekend of every month, we will have a special collection for the Chapel. The eftpos machine in the foyer may also be used. Thank you once again for your generosity.
- Ash Wednesday is on 5th March this year. We generally have two masses on Ash Wednesday - 9.15am and 7pm. We are thinking of having an additional mass in the morning and would like your feedback regarding a preferred time. Please scan the QR code to state your preferences.

Gospel - John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from – only the servants who had drawn the water knew – the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
