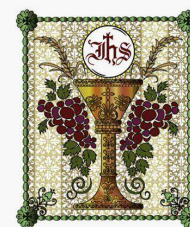

The Holy Spirit's Intercession — Part I

The Apostle Paul teaches in his Letter to the Romans that the Holy Spirit intercedes for us in accordance with God's will. What, exactly, does this mean?

Many years ago, a friend of mine was going through a very difficult period in her life. To make matters worse, when she would attempt to take her needs to the Lord in prayer, she found that she couldn't pray. Her mind was so focused on the difficulty of her circumstances that she simply could not concentrate in prayer the way she needed to. If there was ever a time in her life when she needed to pray, it was then. And yet, she found that she was too weak, frustrated, frightened, and discouraged to be able to pray effectively. She was facing a double hardship now: a difficult trial and the inability to pray effectively concerning it.

I listened patiently to her as she poured out her heart to me concerning these things. As she spoke, the Holy Spirit brought back to my remembrance St Paul's teaching in the Letter to the Romans concerning this very thing. In that letter, he instructed the believers as follows:

The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for us in accordance with God's will. (Rom 8:26-27).

One of the great blessings that come to us when we receive the Holy Spirit is that he intercedes for us day and night before the Father. According to St Paul, when he intercedes for us, he utters groans, supplications, and pleadings to God which we are not able to hear; only God is able to hear them. If no one on the entire planet ever prayed for you again, you would still have an Intercessor, the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to all who are in Christ.

Not only this, but according to Paul, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us in accordance with God's will. What, exactly, does this mean?

We may consider ourselves 'prayer warriors' or know people who would fall into this category. But no matter how effective we or others may be when it comes to prayer, we can never match the Holy Spirit's intercessions for us. Man is not omniscient. Because we are not all-knowing, we do not always know the proper way in which to pray concerning our circumstances. Not so with the Holy Spirit, who intercedes for us in accordance with the Father's will. Because he is part of the Trinity, he knows exactly why God is allowing us to face certain circumstances and what he wants to accomplish in our lives through those circumstances. He knows exactly what God's will is for each and every single one of our lives.

He knows where we are strong and where we need to improve or be changed altogether. No matter how many situations confront us in a given day, he knows exactly how God desires to use them in our lives, and it is on the basis of all this knowledge that he intercedes for us in accordance with the Father's will.

A brother in Christ calls you up and informs you that he has lost his job. He then asks you to pray for him and his family. You get off the phone, kneel down in the living room, and begin to intercede. What do you pray? Probably the same thing that I would pray. "Lord, please give my brother a job. He has a family to support and bills to pay. He will lose his house if you do not provide this job for him. In Jesus' Name I pray. Amen." You then get up and go about your business.

You have interceded for your brother, just as he asked you to do. But have you interceded in accordance with the Father's will? You cannot, for you are not God and you do not fully understand the divine purpose for your brother's job loss.

The Holy Spirit, however, has complete knowledge concerning God's will for your friend's life. He knows the areas in your friend's character that need to be developed and changed so that he will become more like Christ. He is fully aware of the spiritual fruit that God desires to cultivate or prune in your friend's life. He knows the areas in your friend's life which are hindering him from growing in the grace and knowledge of Christ, and he knows exactly how God plans to be glorified in his life.

So, what does he do? While you're crying out to God to bless your brother in Christ with employment, the Spirit is crying out for God to achieve the spiritual, heavenly purpose behind that unemployment. He knows exactly why God allowed it and how God desires to use it. When the Holy Spirit prays, this is precisely what he asks for. His prayers will always line up with God's specific will for our lives. This is what Paul is referring to when he teaches that the Spirit intercedes for us in accordance with God's will.

Gospel - Luke 9:11-17

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, ‘Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.’ He replied, ‘Give them something to eat yourselves.’ But they said, ‘We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.’ For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, ‘Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.’ They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.
